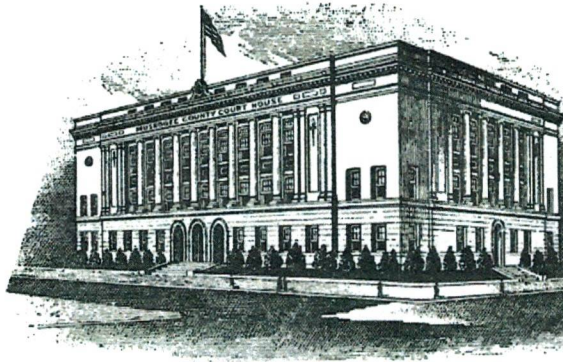

Hi Undersheriff

I'll talk to you about this tomorrow afternoon in person.

Attached is a quote that includes 3 items:

1: License, setup and configuration of the cameras servers for remote viewing on cell phones anytime you have service.

2: A new firewall - this piece is what took so long to figure out.

Why is this needed? When we allow the cameras to be viewed outside via the app, we are opening up a hole in the network and the old current firewall really limits visibility of what is coming in and out of the MCSO network. As you see on the news with Ransomware attacks on the rise even as close at City of Tulsa, and recently the big Colonial Pipeline ransomware - I REALLY feel uncomfortable opening up ports for this without being able to secure it.

If it makes you feel any better, the existing firewall is End of Life and End of Support, meaning I was going to recommend we replace this in the near future anyway... Too much going on in the works of ransomware and cyber security for us to turn a blind eye to this.

3: Antivirus software. Historically, at MCSO we only put anti-virus software on the computers that access the Internet. The Camera server array is not currently internet connected, so we never covered them. We will need to include them on the ESET Antivirus array and this is year of server protection under the current AV suite.

Last Bonus piece - Melissa at the jail has been asking me to setup ODIS on a laptop for away viewing, as well as multiple deputies wanting ODIS in their units. The new firewall will allow us to install VPN clients and

allow ODIS to be public facing, so that will be a possibility now. It currently is not with the current firewall, so this is a value add for us.
